For certainty, the Ministry will not be responsible for obtaining and will have no obligation to obtain any such permit, licence, consent, approval or authorization to the extent that such permit, licence, consent, approval or authorization results from or relates to any deviation in the Design from the Reference Concept.</p>	<p>The Environmental Assessment Agency (Agency) has made the following determinations based on the noted Ministry Reference Concept submissions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Under <i>CEAA</i>, a screening assessment determination was made on the section of works proposed between Dewdney and Hwy 1 on Aug 10, 2011. The Agency’s determination was that the project was not likely to cause significant adverse environmental effects. (Canadian Environmental Assessment Registry: 10-01-57577) 2. Under <i>CEAA 2012</i>, the Ministry carried out a self-evaluation based on the Reference Concept for the Project and submitted a letter to the Agency. The Agency replied on November 24, 2014 that the proposed work does not meet the threshold defined in the current <i>Regulations Designating Physical Activities S.25c</i> and as such the <i>CEAA</i> does not apply. <p>An Environmental Review was completed related to the portion of the Project that impacts the Ochapowace First Nations IR# 71-132 pursuant to <i>CEAA</i>. It was determined that an environmental assessment was not required as the activity is not a project as defined in S.66 of <i>CEAA</i>. This was confirmed in a letter from AANDC dated March 3, 2015.</p>
